Fall Storytime - ABCs – Wed and Fri at 10am through November 18



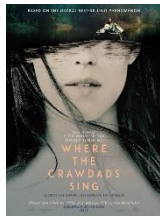

Next: November 17th – Thanksgiving Bingo December 15th - Gingerbread

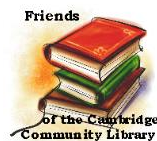
Friday Flicks – October 21st at 1:00pm: Where the Crawdads Sing

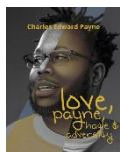
